Library Activities Wk of 4/27/20

This week we're going to activate your thinking as we embark on a journey of discovery! **Kindergarten:**

What are your favorite animals? What kind of animals are **mammals**? Watch this BrainPopJr.® video about <u>mammals</u> to find out what characteristics they have. As you're watching, be thinking about which mammal you like but don't know much about. What about that animal would you like to learn more? Did you know that bats are mammals? Listen to this very popular story, <u>Stellaluna</u>.

First Grade:

First graders, your journey of discovery is in the ocean! (Don't get wet!) As you know there are *many* animals that make the ocean their home. As a matter of fact there are three animal habitats in the ocean. Find out about what kinds of animals live in each part in this video. You may also enjoy listening to one of the MA authors read his book called *Dory Story*.

Second Grade:

We're off to the rainforest, another great place to learn about animals! Listen and watch this <u>story</u> about two friends exploring a rainforest in search of orangutans. Which kind of rainforest animal do you know little about? Which would you like to get to know better? See below for a list of rainforest animals to choose from. Pick one to research and let me know in an email. (hardys@mersd.org)

Third Grade:

If you had to pick your favorite author, who would it be? I know, it's hard to pick just one, but give it a try! Look at the books you have at home. Maybe your favorite is among them. Your journey of discovery will be about an author whose work you especially like. Take a look at the author lists on BrainPopJr.® and BrainPop®®. Ms. Silag, Memorial School's library teacher, has a list here. (Thank you Ms. Silag!) Fourth & Fifth Grades:

Your journey of discovery is going to be very close at hand! This project will allow you an opportunity to strengthen your interviewing skills. Firstly, you'll need to become familiar with the basic principles of conducting a good interview. Watch this <u>video</u> to get started. Now think of a family member you'd like to learn more about. It could be someone living with you now, or someone, like an aunt or grandparent that you could call. (We need to remember social distancing protocols and choose someone you can talk to without compromising those rules.) List 5-10 questions you'd like to ask that person. I've created a place for you in your Google Library Classroom for your person's name and your questions. Please do <u>not</u> conduct your interview yet!
