Grades 1 & 2

Suggested Resources for French Grade 5

In 5th Grade we will be having an oral test later this Spring. Here is an activity to practice the weather words, one of our main topics.!

Everybody loves the Bubbles (Burbujas) game! You can choose the topic that you want and the difficulty level. We use this in class but students rarely get to play by themselves; in order for everyone to get a turn we play on teams- so go crazy! Username and password are both mersdstudent.
